ACCEPTANCE OF THE AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION

ACCEPTANCE OF THE AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION

- 1. At its Seventy-sixth Session, the Council adopted amendments to the Constitution (Council Resolution No. 997 of 24 November 1998). According to Article 30, paragraph 2, of the Constitution, the entry into force of the amendments is subject to acceptance, in accordance with their respective constitutional processes, by two thirds of the Member States.
- 2. These amendments aim at strengthening the structure and streamlining the decision-making process of IOM. They represent an important development for the future of the Organization. The Council, in the above-mentioned resolution and again in Council Resolution No. 1013 of 1 December 1999, called upon Member States to accept these amendments as early as possible and to inform the Director General accordingly. Similar calls have been made over time by various Chairpersons of the Council and the Director General of IOM, most recently through a letter dated 23 February 2011 (see Annex I) sent to States that had not yet accepted the amendments. The IOM Legal Counsel is also conducting a round of meetings with Ambassadors and other senior staff of these States to further encourage the acceptance of the amendments.
- 3. To date, only 70 States have notified the Director General of their acceptance of the amendments (see Annex II), out of a total membership of 132 States.
- 4. Member States that have not yet accepted the amendments (see Annex III) are once again invited to do so as soon as possible as a matter of priority and to notify the Director General accordingly.

Annex I

I have the honour to refer to the 76th Session of the Council, held in November 1998, which adopted amendments to the Constitution of the International Organization for Migration (IOM). These amendments aim at strengthening the structure and streamlining the decision-making process of IOM: they represent as such an important development for the future of our Organization. They are annexed to Resolution No. 997 (LXXVI), a copy of which is enclosed for ease of reference.

According to Article 30, paragraph 2, of IOM's Constitution, the entry into force of these amendments is subject to their acceptance by two-thirds of the members in accordance with their respective constitutional processes.

To date, only 67 States have ratified these amendments, out of a total membership of 132 (see list enclosed). On behalf and at the request of the Chairman of the IOM Council, His Excellency Ambassador Idriss Jazaïry, I ask your Government to take urgent and decisive steps towards accepting these amendments which, once in force, will allow the Organization better to fulfil its responsibilities.

I am confident of being able to count on the support of your Government in this undertaking and shall appreciate your reporting to me any progress made on this matter.

Please accept, Excellency, the assurance of my highest consideration.
