### APPLICATION BY PAPUA NEW GUINEA FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE ORGANIZATION

- 1. In a letter dated 28 November 2012, Papua New Guinea applied for membership in the International Organization for Migration. The letter and the Director General's reply, dated 29 November 2012, are reproduced in the annexes to this document.
- 2. In accordance with Article 2(b) of the Constitution, the Council is required to make a decision regarding the application of Papua New Guinea for membership and the rate of its financial contribution to the administrative requirements of the Organization, which the Director General recommends should be assessed at 0.0022 per cent of the total contributions required from Member States to the Administrative Part of the Budget.
- 3. An appropriate draft resolution will be submitted to the Council for consideration.

# LETTER DATED 28 NOVEMBER 2012 FROM THE MINISTER FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND IMMIGRATION OF PAPUA NEW GUINEA TO THE DIRECTOR GENERAL OF THE INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION FOR MIGRATION

I have the honour to refer to the relationship existing between the Government of Papua New Guinea and the International Organization for Migration (IOM).

My Government wishes to establish a closer relationship with your Organization and hereby applies for membership in the International Organization for Migration, in accordance with Article 2, paragraph (b) of the IOM Constitution.

It also undertakes to make a financial contribution to the administrative requirements of the Organization, the rate of which will be agreed upon by the IOM Council and the Government of Papua New Guinea.
