- 1. In a letter dated 1 May 2014, a copy of which is appended as Annex I, the President of The Hague Institute for Global Justice made a formal application for his Organization to be accorded observer status at meetings of the IOM Council. The Director General's reply thereto, dated 14 July 2014, is appended as Annex II. An appropriate item will be included on the provisional agenda of the 105th Session of the Council.
- 2. This matter falls under rule 10 of the Rules of Procedure for the Council which provides that the Council may admit, upon their application, international organizations, governmental or non-governmental, concerned with migration, refugees or human resources as observers at its meetings.
- 3. An appropriate draft resolution will be submitted to the Council when this matter comes up for decision.

LETTER DATED 1 MAY 2014 FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE HAGUE INSTITUTE FOR GLOBAL JUSTICE TO THE DIRECTOR GENERAL OF THE INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION FOR MIGRATION
