APPLICATION BY THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF MAURITANIA FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE ORGANIZATION

- 1. In a letter dated 12 February 2003, the Islamic Republic of Mauritania applied for membership in the International Organization for Migration. A copy of the foregoing letter and of the Director General's reply, dated 17 February 2003, are annexed.
- 2. In accordance with Article 2 (b) of the Constitution, the Council is required to make a decision regarding the application of the Islamic Republic of Mauritania for membership and the rate of its contribution to the administrative requirements of the Organization, which the Director General recommends should be assessed at 0.040 per cent of the total contributions required from Member States to the Administrative Part of the Budget.
- 3. An appropriate draft resolution will be submitted for consideration by the Council.

The Government of the Islamic Republic of Mauritania accepts the Constitution of IOM - and the amendments to it of 24 November 1998 - in accordance with its constitutional processes, as well as the obligations resulting from membership. My Government undertakes to make a financial contribution to the administrative requirements of the Organization, the rate of which will be agreed upon by the IOM Council and the Government of the Islamic Republic of Mauritania.

I am pleased to confirm that the necessary steps will be taken to place your Government's application for membership on the agenda of the next session of the IOM Council, to be held in Geneva on 13 June 2003.

A document formally presenting your Government's application for membership will be distributed to all Member States and observers. You will receive a copy of it, together with further details concerning the Council session and the procedure for consideration of your country's application.
