## APPLICATION BY NEW ZEALAND FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE ORGANIZATION

- 1. In a letter received on 28 May 2003, New Zealand applied for membership in the International Organization for Migration. A copy of the foregoing letter and of the Deputy Director General's reply, dated 28 May 2003, are annexed.
- 2. In accordance with Article 2 (b) of the Constitution, the Council is required to make a decision regarding the application of New Zealand for membership and the rate of its contribution to the administrative requirements of the Organization, which the Director General recommends should be assessed at 0.270 per cent of the total contributions required from Member States to the Administrative Part of the Budget.
- 3. An appropriate draft resolution will be submitted for consideration by the Council.

# LETTER RECEIVED ON 28 MAY 2003 FROM THE ACTING MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND TRADE OF NEW ZEALAND ADDRESSED TO THE DIRECTOR GENERAL OF THE INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION FOR MIGRATION

## LETTER DATED 28 MAY 2003 FROM THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR GENERAL OF THE INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION FOR MIGRATION TO THE ACTING MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND TRADE OF NEW ZEALAND

I am confident that your Government's action will be received with satisfaction by the Member States of IOM and would like to express our deep gratification at this further strengthening of the already close and cordial relationship between New Zealand and IOM.

I am pleased to confirm that the necessary steps will be taken to place your Government's application for membership on the agenda of the next session of the IOM Council, to be held in Geneva on 13 June 2003.

A document formally presenting your Government's application for membership will be distributed to all Member States and observers. You will receive a copy of it, together with further details concerning the Council session and the procedure for consideration of your country's application.
