APPLICATION BY JAMAICA FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE ORGANIZATION

- 1. In a letter dated 17 November 2004, the Government of Jamaica applied for membership in the International Organization for Migration. A copy of the letter and of the Director General's reply, dated 6 December 2004, are annexed.
- 2. In accordance with Article 2 (b) of the Constitution, the Council is required to make a decision regarding the application of the Government of Jamaica for membership and the rate of its contribution to the administrative requirements of the Organization, which the Director General recommends should be assessed at 0.035 per cent of the total contributions required from Member States to the Administrative Part of the Budget.
- 3. An appropriate draft resolution will be submitted for consideration by the Council.

LETTER DATED 17 NOVEMBER 2004 FROM THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND FOREIGN TRADE OF JAMAICA, ADDRESSED TO THE DIRECTOR GENERAL OF THE INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION FOR MIGRATION

I have the honour to refer to the relationship existing between the Government of Jamaica and the International Organization for Migration (IOM).

My Government desires to establish a closer relationship with your Organization and hereby applies for membership in the International Organization for Migration in accordance with Article 2, paragraph (b) of the IOM Constitution.

The Government of Jamaica accepts the Constitution and the amendments thereto of 24 November 1998, in accordance with its constitutional processes and the obligations resulting from membership. It also undertakes to make a financial contribution to the administrative requirements of the Organization, the rate of which will be agreed upon by the IOM Council and the Government of Jamaica.

LETTER DATED 6 DECEMBER 2004 FROM THE DIRECTOR GENERAL OF THE INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION FOR MIGRATION TO THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND FOREIGN TRADE OF JAMAICA
