RESOLUTION No. 327 (XXII)

(Adopted by the Council at its 196th meeting on 12 November 1964)

DIRECTOR'S REPORT ON ICEM'S DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES

The Council of the Intergovernmental Committee for European Migration,

Having considered the Director's Report on ICEM's Policy and Programmes (MC/681), and particularly paragraph 37 thereof which concerns the preparation of a plan of action for the years 1964-67, including, as guide lines, the observations made by the members of the Council on such paragraph;

Recognizing that the promotion of selective migration adapted to the needs of the receiving countries is a very effective form of aid to the social and economic development of Latin America;

Having taken note with satisfaction of the increased emphasis being given by the Administration to the selection of highly skilled migrants for Latin America;

Bearing in mind, however, that a well planned programme of selective migration needs the consent and active support of the governments concerned,

1. *Invites* its Latin American Member Governments, in order to give effect to this practical form of development aid through promoting and increasing selective migration, to identify the economic sectors for and to determine the conditions under which such migration should be effected through the services of ICEM in Europe working in co-operation with European Member Governments;

2. *Resolves:*

- (i) To request the Director, taking into account the views expressed in the course of the debate on the Report on Policy and Programmes and in close co-operation with Member Governments, to continue to develop a plan of action, to promote selective migration programmes to Latin American Member countries and to report progress thereon at the 1965 Spring Session;
- (ii) To request the Director to take all appropriate measures to effectuate closer active co-operation with national and international aid organizations in order to facilitate the solution of financial and other problems affecting the orderly supply of specialized manpower for the development programmes of Latin America.
