


#### Visit to IOM Haiti and IOM Colombia Pay tribute to IOM Staff

## **IOM Haiti** 2013 Mid-Year Mission Snapshot

- Mission Established in Haiti in 1994
- Haiti is an IOM Member State since 1994
- IOM Haiti currently has:
  - 40 Active Projects
  - **537** Staffs:
    - 488 Nationals
    - 49 Internationals
  - 4 Sub-Offices:
    - Cap Haitien
    - Leogane
    - Jacmel
    - Gonaives

- IOM Haiti Expenditures for 2010-2011: 190.67 million USD


-Budget remaining for 2013 (as of 30 June 2013): USD 28,477,426.

- Health, Psychosocial, Cholera Response

- Reconstruction, Community Stabilization and Early Recovery
- Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency
  Preparedness
- Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration
- Counter-Trafficking
- Migration Management and Border Management

# **IOM Colombia**

#### **Mission Snapshot**



- Colombia is an IOM Member State since 1955.
- Geographic Coverage: IOM implements projects in all 32 Colombian departments and in 637 municipalities out of the out of the 1123.
- Country IOM Staff (June 2013): approx. 1300 staff / consultants
  - Budget: The estimated budget for 2013 is USD108 million.

## **IOM Colombia**

Visit

- Peace process was emphasized since it represents a huge challenge for the Government.
- IOM's expertise in topics such as demobilization, reintegration and victims' reparation was presented and the role that can be played by the Mission to support the Government was also underlined.
- Peace talks are currently debating the second item of the agenda which refers to political participation.





## Reflections

- Recognition of professional staff;
- Recognition of IOM on the ground;
- Renew the donor's interest in Haiti to support the transition from the emergency phase to recovery and technical cooperation;
- Develop more income-generating projects in Haiti;
- Colombia should be used as a model in them of activities, cooperation with the government, etc.
- Council chair visit should take place at the beginning of the mandate of each Chair.
