STATEMENT BY MONGOLIA 29 November 2023

Thank you Chair.

Distinguished representatives,

First, I would like to thank the Director General and the Chairperson of the Council for their leadership, as well as the staff of the IOM for their hard work and dedication.

I join the previous speakers in extending congratulations to the newly elected officers and wish them success.

I would like to express Mongolia's commendation for the IOM's consistent fulfillment of its designated functions and successful implementation of its strategic goals and policies.

The pivotal and distinctive role of the IOM has become increasingly apparent in addressing timely issues such as climate-induced human mobility, displacement, and the escalating need for humanitarian aid in recent years.
