

#### MAKING THE MOST OF THE PROCESS: PRACTICAL GUIDE

#### **Planning**

- Setting up a technical working group
- Agreeing on key objectives & Developing a template for gathering data

#### Implementation

- Collecting, verifying, and analyzing data
- Conducting additional capacity building activities
- Drafting and "endorsing" the findings

# Launch and Follow-Up

- Finalizing the draft and launching
- Agreeing on the update (regularity, format, responsible entities)



#### MIGRATION PROFILE & GLOBAL COMPACT ON MIGRATION

### OBJECTIVE 1 - COLLECT and UTILIZE ACCURATE and DISAGGREGATED DATA as a BASIS for EVIDENCE-BASED POLICIES

- j) Develop and use country-specific migration profiles, which include disaggregated data on *all migration-relevant aspects* in a national context, including those on labour market needs, demand and availability of skills, the economic, environmental and social impacts of migration, remittance transfer costs, health, and education, occupation, living and working conditions, wages, and the needs of migrants and receiving communities, in order to develop evidence-based migration policies.
