WHY HAS IOM DEVELOPED THIS NEW POLICY?

MORE THAN 40 YEARS OF EXPERIENCE IN THE FIELD OF RETURN MIGRATION

- AVRR developed and implemented in Europe, now expanded worldwide
- More than **1,7 million migrants supported**
- In 2020, IOM supported migrants in **139 host/transit countries to return to 150 countries of origin** →
reflects global trends and the growing need for return and reintegration support
- **Reintegration assistance: from individualized assistance to an integrated approach**

CHANGING GLOBAL MIGRATION GOVERNANCE LANDSCAPE

- RRR becoming a **policy priority** for migration governance and development strategies of many governments
- the New York Declaration for Refugees and Migrants
- the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration (GCM)
- IOM's appointment as coordinator and Secretariat of the UN Network on Migration

TIME FOR IOM TO CONSOLIDATE RRR PROGRAMMING THROUGH A HOLISTIC ORGANIZATIONAL APPROACH

WHY HAS IOM DEVELOPED THIS NEW POLICY?

DEVELOPMENT AND RELEASE IN MAY 2021

- **Internal** Policy developed on years of experience
- Support the implementation of IOM's Strategic Vision 2019-2023
- Adopt a **holistic organizational approach** to return migration
- Provide a blueprint for States to set up comprehensive rights-based return programmes

2030 AGENDA AND GCM RECOGNIZE RRR AS INTEGRAL COMPONENTS OF MIGRATION GOVERNANCE

- Policy = a step forward for IOM's support to the attainment of the RRR goals/objectives of the GCM/SDGs

To guide IOM's work on return migration through a holistic, rights-based and sustainable development-oriented approach



To better enable the Organization to support its partners through the provision of capacity development and advice on return, readmission and sustainable reintegration



To advocate for and provide a tool to States for the implementation of internationally agreed standards and effective practices
