




Internal displacements by disasters in millions



Magnitude of the Problem





8.7 million

Internally displaced people as a result of disasters in 88 countries and territories as of 31 December 2022

A 45% Increase in the number of people internally displaced by disasters since 2021

Increase of Disasters over time

Event	Increase between 1980-1999 and 2000- 2019
Disasters recorded	83% increase
Flood events	134% increase
Extreme temperature events	232% increase
Number of people affected	21% increase
Global economic costs	82% increase
Climate related disasters and	100% increase (and more than 600%
affected people in HRP	increase over the two decades
contexts	prior(1969-1979)
