

IOM's Response to Migration Crises 2022







Humanitarian Coordination



IOM actively participates in humanitarian coordination fora at the global, regional, and country levels.

In 2022:



Held a leadership role in 72 countries

Held a coordination role in 181 coordination structures (clusters, sectors, working groups, platforms)

27% increase since 2021



Camp Coordination and Camp Management







2,050 sites reached with CCCM activities



37 country operations




IOM's coordination role in 31 CCCM mechanisms (19%+)


IOM was the largest recipient of shelter funding

Humanitarian Protection



3 million people reached with direct humanitarian protection assistance



+58 countries with protection operations



IOM partnered with 67 local womenled organizations across 32 countries





Emergency Health, Mental Health, and Psychosocial Support



+23,000 health-care workers provided with capacity building



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+130,000 health assessments conducted for refugee resettlement

+2.9 million people vaccinated in crisis settings



1.5 million MHPSS services offered to crisis-affected populations



16,000 people trained in MHPSS





Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) <u>Home | Displacement Tracking Matrix (iom.int)</u>



DTM data was used as a full or partial data source for 86 per cent (25 out of 29) of HNOs/HRPs developed in 2022 (2%+)



The movements and needs of over 51.2M IDPs, 39.3M IDP returnees, 2M returnees from abroad and 5.2M migrants were tracked and monitored



Information on migration flows was collected and produced in over 92 countries





Localization



Partnership with local and national actors across 76 country offices



Rapid Response Fund in Ethiopia, Sudan and South Sudan.



Development of a localization framework and guidance note



Localization indicators added to the institutional Strategic Results Framework.





Accountability to Affected Populations



34 IOM country missions supported for AAP mainstreaming



Leads an inter-agency AAP project to strengthen leadership engagement and in-country capacity



More than 3,500 staff received AAP basic training




