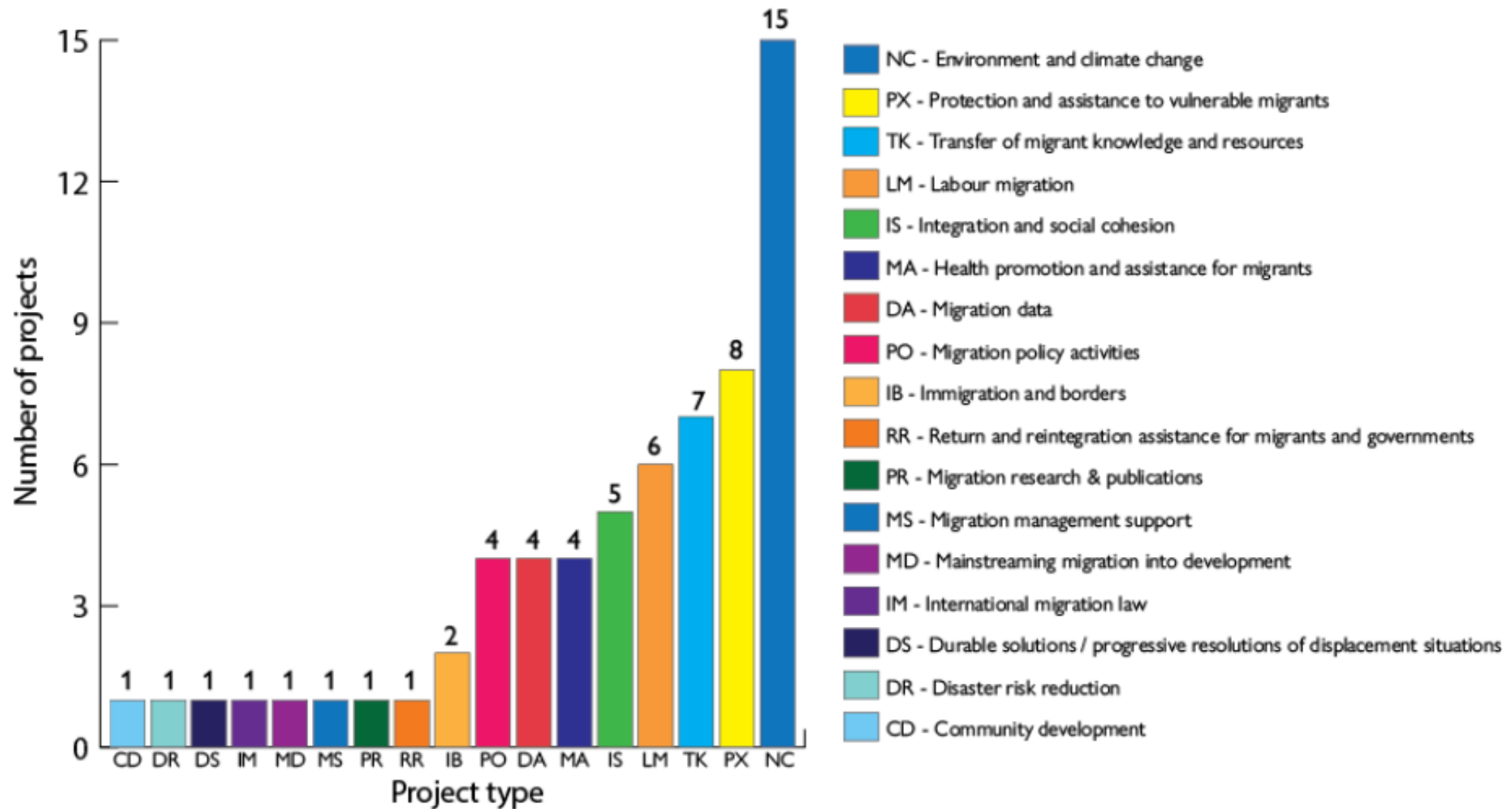

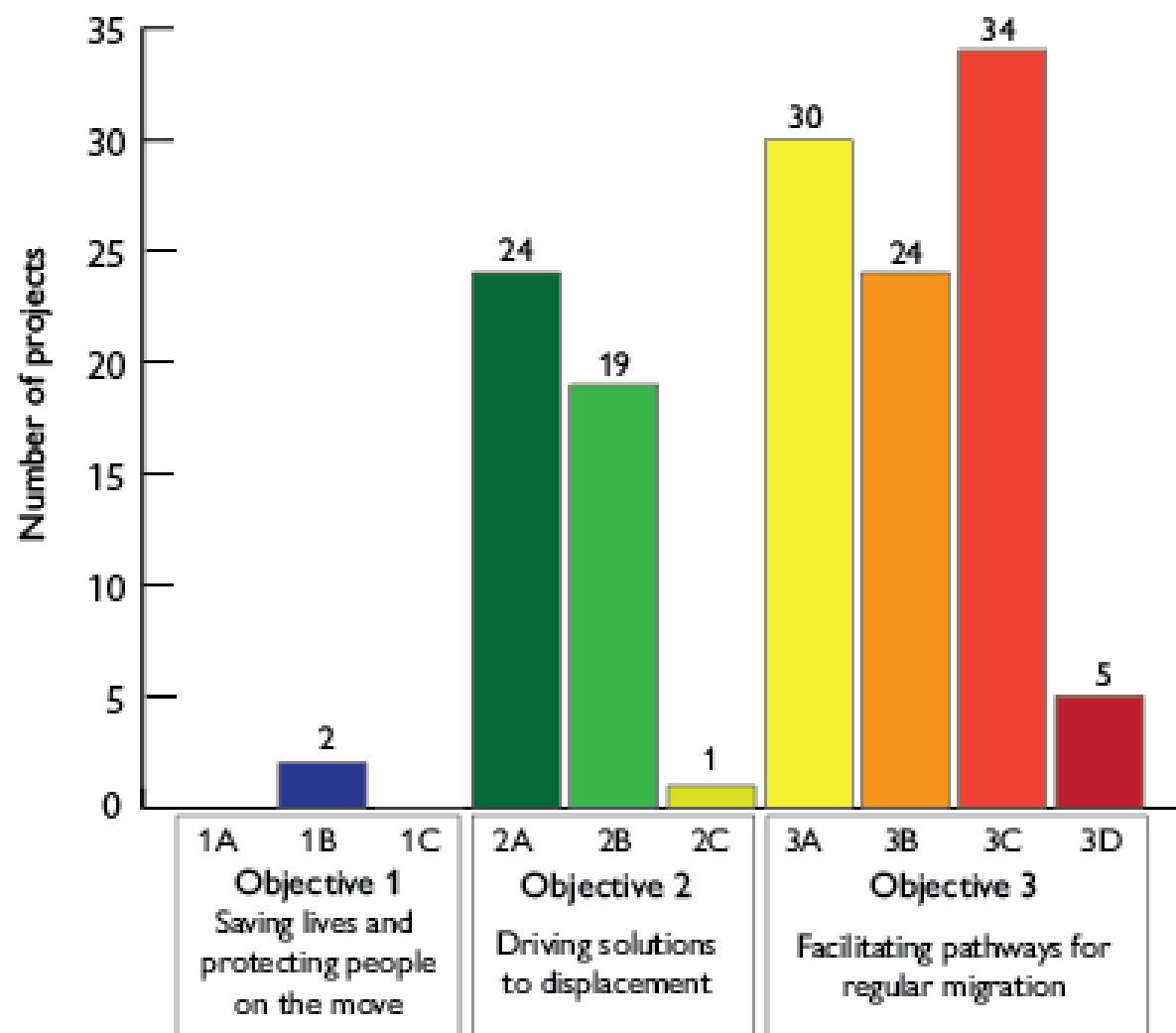

## Driving solutions to displacement



- 1A: Alleviating suffering and upholding the dignity and rights of people affected by crises
- 1B: Reducing threats and mitigating vulnerabilities through humanitarian protection
- 1C: Enhancing the quality of humanitarian assistance and response
- 2A: Minimizing drivers and structural factors that compel people to leave their homes
- 2B: Increasing the recovery, resilience, and self-reliance of displaced people
- 2C: Resettlement and relocation solutions for displaced people
- 3A: Sustainable and responsive channels for regular migration
- 3B: Well-managed migration flows and cross-border mobility
- 3C: Coordinated migration policy and legal frameworks
- 3D: Societal acceptance of migrants of all genders, ages, disabilities, and legal statuses

## Trends for projects completed in 2023



**20% of projects completed in 2023 received follow-up funding**, demonstrating the effectiveness and impact of the seed funding.



**12% of projects completed in 2023 had highly innovative elements**, demonstrating the Fund's increased attention on innovative project ideas.




**40% of projects completed in 2023 helped meet Member States' policy development needs**, demonstrating the Fund's continued role in that respect.



**20% of projects completed in 2023 were climate mobility-related.**
