

Reached with shelter and settlement interventions in 83 countries.

11.2 MILLION PEOPLE

Reached with safe access to water, sanitation and hygiene in 65 countries.

5.3 MILLION PEOPLE

Reached with Camp Coordination and Camp Management operations in 46 countries.

18 INTER-AGENCY HUMANITARIAN HUBS

Managed by IOM in 4 countries.

DATA

DTM informed 21 out of 26 Humanitarian Response Plans.



6.8 MILLION PEOPLE

Primary healthcare consultations conducted in crises.

1 MILLION PEOPLE

Reached with mental health and psychosocial support.

2.6 MILLION PEOPLE

Reached with **protection services** across 75 countries.

15 PILOT COUNTRIES

Supported on the S.G. Action Agenda on Internal Displacement with strategies, action plans and financing frameworks.

2.5 MILLION PEOPLE

Directly benefited from peace and recovery interventions.

6,000 former combatants

Reached with reintegration support across 24 countries.

19 countries

Supported with early warning systems.



150,000 REFUGEES

Provided with **resettlement** support.

209,000 REFUGEES

Reached with migration health assessments for resettlement.

25,000 MIGRANTS

Provided with voluntary humanitarian return support or access to humanitarian admissions.





ENABLERS AND CROSS-CUTTING CONSIDERATIONS

LOCALIZATION

- USD 107.5 million transferred to local and national actors.
- Partnered with 151 local women-led organizations across 29 countries.

RAPID RESPONSE FUND

- Provided USD 21.1 million in direct funding to 104 NGOs.
- Operational in Ethiopia, Myanmar, Nigeria, South Sudan and Sudan.

GLOBAL STOCKS

- 4,905 m3 of essential household, shelter, and WASH items delivered to 13 countries in crisis.
- Over USD 15.3 million in medicines and medical supplies distributed.



ENABLERS AND CROSS-CUTTING CONSIDERATIONS

ACCOUNTABILITY TO AFFECTED POPULATIONS

 Multi-channel complaints and feedback mechanisms in 116 countries.

PREVENTION OF SEXUAL EXPLOITATION AND ABUSE (PSEA)

- 73 new dedicated PSEA officers across nearly 50 countries.
- PSEA focal points in 146 countries.

CONFLICT SENSITIVITY

 Dedicated resources assigned to conflict analysis and applying conflict sensitivity lens in emergency response in Ukraine and Sudan.


